
BUNKER BURIALS, DOVER BRANCH



Garrison site: North side of Piscataqua Road; plot 50' x 60'; fenced by granite posts and bars. The graveyard contains ten unmarked depressions, eight graves marked with rough field stones and fifteen marked with, mostly, white marble tombstones. Graves were unmarked during the 1600's as Indians would steal from the dead, therefore the first ten deaths in the family are probably lying in the unmarked graves. The next eight interments were probably marked with the field stones. The above is pure speculation, as any combination of marked or unmarked grave is possible.

Madbury site: North of Freshet Road; plot 55'square, marked with four granite boundary posts.

Madbury's oldest graveyard contains 30 field stones indicating the final resting place of Zacharaih 3 (D11), his wife Dorcas and other family members, and dates from 1731 to 1747, according to the Historical Society. The graveyard was discovered in 1986 by BFA members and a local historian. (Noted on chart by ^)

Durham cemetery: The town cemetery contains the four graves of Zachariah 5 (D85), his wife Mercy Varney and two of eleven children. (Noted on chart by asterisk)
